Commitments We Wish to Preserve

- 1. Reformed Catholicism (as opposed to either Reformed Fundamentalism or a more generic Evangelicalism): *reformata sed semper reformanda*; an openness to new light from Holy Scripture changing our thinking or practice. A willingness to be counter-cultural.
- 2. Faithfulness to Lord's Day Worship morning and evening and to a Service of Corporate Prayer. A commitment to worship rather than a service structured for unbelievers.
- 3. Liturgical Seriousness; Weekly Communion; Music that rises to the standard of the best in the Christian Tradition
- 4. Deep Exposition of Holy Scripture as the foundation of preaching and teaching
- 5. Emphasis on the Christian Family as a Primary Means of Salvation and the enlargement of the kingdom of God in the world
- 6. Christian Education as an important part of the nurture of covenant children
- 7. Mission Focus: an interest demonstrated in prayer and financial support for ministries elsewhere in the country and the world
- 8. Generosity in diaconal ministry to the needy
- 9. The practice of Male Headship (and so the cultivation of the grace of leadership among the church's men)
- 10. The continued cultivation of men for the Christian ministry
- 11. The cherishing and exploiting of the gifts of women and the appreciation and support of their ministries
- 12. Youth Ministry
- 13. The Practice of Hospitality
- 14. Presbytery and General Assembly Focus
- 15. The Practice of Church Discipline
- 16. A commitment to Sunday School
- 17. The encouragement of Christian ministerial entrepreneurship (as before in the establishment of Care Net, Covenant High School, and Resurrection Presbyterian Church)
- 18. Joyful obedience: serious discipleship vs. nominal commitment.
- 19. A focus on the life of the church as well as that of the individual believer.

Developments Needing to be Fostered

- 1. A more public focus on evangelism
- 2. The elimination of the church's debt as a means of increasing her investment in the kingdom of God
- 3. The cultivation of the gifts and graces (and active participation in the church's ministry) of our younger men: more active discipleship
- 4. Diaconal entrepreneurship
- 5. Communication: use of social media to extend the ministry
