Covenant High School Annual Report for 2019-2020

2019-2020 Highlights

- The school was blessed with an enrollment of 88 students for the 2019-2020 school year.
- Covenant High School scored fifth in the nation on the CLT and CLT-10 tests. The CLT (Classic Learning Test) is a new alternative to the SAT and ACT. It is accepted by over 180 Christian colleges nationally.
- All classes were transitioned to online four days after Governor Inslee closed schools on March 13. Covenant still issued grades and seniors graduated on-time. Commencement was held outside at Faith Presbyterian Church in August.
- 33% of the class of 2020 earned Washington State Honors Awards. This award recognizes students scoring in the top 10% of graduates in Washington State.
- Faculty received a full day of professional development training in fostering Socratic discussion in the classroom.
- In lieu of a concert, a choir video was produced by alum Jonathan Gross mixing solos together. This video received over 100 likes, 59 shares, and reached almost 6000 people on Facebook.
- During the COVID pandemic and school closure, Mrs. Logan Hope and the Honor Society organized a food and clothing drive with Tacoma Rescue Mission. Students and community members donated over 1,000 items.
